Many people read daily, weekly or monthly horoscope predictions in newspapers, magazines or online. In Western astrology, forecasts for the twelve signs of the zodiac are based on the position of the planets when the Sun is in a particular region of the sky. The twelve animal signs of Chinese astrology are based on a calendar according to the phases of the Moon.
